

Twisted Ribbons Scarf and Cowl

Materials: 440 yds Worsted weight yarn for Scarf
225 yds of Worsted weight yarn for Cowl
42 beads, preferably 5/0's, but 6/0's will work – with effort (optional for cowl)
Size 7 Needles, darning needle
1.15 – 1.25 mm crochet hook, small enough to go through the bead
and hook the loop of yarn to pull it through the bead (optional for cowl)

Glossary:

K=knit **P**=purl

st(s)=stitch(es)

RS=right side

WS=wrong side

YO=yarn over

SSK= slip 2sts knitwise, knit together through back of loops

K2T= knit 2 sts together

Cable 6 Front (C6Front): Slip 2 sts to 1st cable needle in front of work, slip next 2 sts to 2nd cable needle in back of work. K2, P2 from 1st cable needle, K2 from 2nd cable needle

Cable 6 Back(C6Back): Slip 4 sts to cable needle in back of work, slip next 2 sts to 2nd cable needle from cable needle, P2, slide last 2 sts from cable needle to left needle, K2

Attaching the Beads: Using the crochet hook, place bead over hook, catch the loop of the stitch on the left needle to be beaded and purled as indicated in the chart, slide bead over loop and place back on the left needle then purl that stitch.

Twisted Ribbons Scarf and Cowl Instructions

Cast on 46 sts for Scarf Knit 4 rows of garter stitch, knit every row. Start Row 1 of written or Chart. Repeat from *to* 2 times each row. Repeat 28 row pattern repeat 14 times. Width 7-1/2", Length 60". End on row 25 or 11 ready to knit on WS, 4 rows of garter stitch, bind off on right side.

Cast on 60 sts with provisional cast on either crochet or knit for Cowl Keeping stitches on waste yarn or cable needle. Start with Row 1 of written or Chart instructions. Repeat from *to* 3 times each row. Repeat 28 row pattern repeat 6 times – or measure around neck to fit. End Cowl on row 28 and graft stitches together with cast on sts with kitchener stitch.

Twisted Ribbons Written Instructions

Row 1: K2, P1, K1, YO, SSK, P2, ***P4, K2T, YO, K1 P2, K1 YO, SSK, P2***, P4, K2T, YO, K1, P1, K2
Row 2: K3, P3, K4, ***K2, P3, K2, P3, K4***, K2, P3, K3
Row 3: K2, P1, K2, YO, SSK, P1, ***P3, K2T, YO, K2, P2, K2, YO, SSK, P1***, P3, K2T, YO, K2, P1, K2
Row 4: K3, P4, K3, ***K1, P4, K2, P4, K3***, K1, P4, K3
Row 5: K2, P1, K3, YO, SSK, ***P2, K2T, YO, K3, P2, K3, YO, SSK***, P2, K2T, YO, K3, P1, K2
Row 6: K3, P5, K2, ***P5, K2, P5, K2***, P5, K3
Row 7: K2, P1, YO, SSK, K3, ***P2, K3, K2T, YO, P2, YO, SSK, K3***, P2, K3, K2T, YO, P1, K2
Row 8: K4, P4, K2, ***P4, K4, P4, K2***, P4, K4
Row 9: K2, P2, YO, SSK, K2, ***P2, K2, K2T, YO, P4, YO, SSK, K2***, P2, K2, K2T, YO, P2, K2
Row 10: K5, P3, K2, ***P3, K6, P3, K2***, P3, K5
Row 11: K2, P3, YO, SSK, K1, ***P2, K1, K2T, YO, P6, YO, SSK, K1***, P2, K1, K2T, YO, P3, K2
Row 12: K6, P2, K2, ***P2, K8, P2, K2***, P2, K6
Row 13: K2, P4, ***C6Front, P8***, C6Front, P4, K2
Row 14: K6, P2, K2, ***P2, K8, P2, K2***, P2, K6
Row 15: K2, P3, K2T, YO, K1, ***P2, K1, YO, SSK, P6, K2T, YO, K1***, P2, K1, YO, SSK, P3, K2
Row 16: K5, P3, K2, ***P3, K6, P3, K2***, P3, K5
Row 17: K2, P2, K2T, YO, K2, ***P2, K2, YO, SSK, P4, K2T, YO, K2***, P2, K2, YO, SSK, P2, K2
Row 18: K4, P4, K2, ***P4, K4, P4, K2***, P4, K4
Row 19: K2, P1, K2T, YO, K3, ***P2, K3, YO, SSK, P2, K2T, YO, K3***, P2, K3, YO, SSK, P1, K2
Row 20: K3, P5, K2, ***P5, K2, P5, K2***, P5, K3
Row 21: K2, P1, K3, K2T, YO, ***P2, YO, SSK, K3, P2, K3, K2T, YO***, P2, YO, SSK, K3, P1, K2
Row 22: K3, P4, K3, ***K1, P4, K2, P4, K3***, K1, P4, K3
Row 23: K2, P1, K2, K2T, YO, P1, ***P3, YO, SSK, K2, P2, K2, K2T, YO, P1***, P3, YO, SSK, K2, P1, K2
Row 24: K3, P3, K4, ***K2, P3, K2, P3, K4***, K2, P3, K3
Row 25: K2, P1, K1, K2T, YO, P2, ***P4, YO, SSK, K1, P2, K1, K2T, YO, P2***, P4, YO, SSK, K1, P1, K2
Row 26: K3, P2, K5, ***K3, P2, K2, P2, K5***, K3, P2, K3
Row 27: K2, P1, K2, P3, ***P5, C6Back, P3***, P5, K2, P1, K2
Row 28: K3, P2, K5, ***K3, P2, K2, P2, K5***, K3, P2, K3

Repeat from *and to* 3 times for Scarf and 4 times for Cowl

Optional beads Insert bead on WS of work on Row 12 - purl stitch 21 and 7 of chart and Row 26 - purl stitch 19 of chart. See "Attaching the Beads" above. It is now ready to be part of the cable cross.
