EASTER

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Tapestry Cosmetic Bag

Materials

1 ball each of Katia Fair Cotton in the following colours:
13 (light pink), 14 (raspberry red), 16 (turquoise), 21 (pale orange) y 24 (midnight blue).

Crochet hook: D3 (U.S.)/(3 mm)

Wool sewing needle

Scissors

One button

One stitch marker (optional)

Note: The pattern is made up of various areas of colour. Each area represents a colour change, therefore, you can use a combination of 2 to 12 colours.

Measurements

24 x 21 cm

Stitches

ch st: chain st

sc: single crochet

sl st: slip stitch

Work in single crochet inserting the hook through the back of the loop on the previous row.

Work in spiral and use a marker to identify the last st on each row.

The colours on each row move within the stitches and alternate according to the graph.

For the colour change: start the last stitch with its corresponding colour and finish with the new colour.

Instructions

Using col. 14 of **Katia Fair Cotton** work 64 ch st.

Row 1: 1 sc in the second ch st from the hook, 61 sc, 3 sc in the last ch st, (turn work to continue) 61 sc, 2 sc in the last ch st.

Without closing the row, continue working 128 sts in spiral.



Row 2: 1 sc in each st (128 sc)

Row 3 and onwards: Follow the diagram. Each square represents 1 sc working in the back of the loop on the previous row. This is the same 16 st pattern which is repeated 8 times until the row is completed.

Row 48: Work the buttonhole for the fastening; In the middle of the row work 5 ch sts in the air and skip 5 sts from the previous row. Work the buttonhole on the 2 sides of the work; on the front and on the back.

Row 49: To integrate the buttonhole: work 5 sc in each hole created on the previous row (= inside the chain sts). Work the rest of the row like the previous ones.

Rows 50 – 51: Work following the diagram. Finish row 51 with one sl st in the following st. Cut the yarn and hide the loose end with the help of the wool sewing needle.

Sew the button onto one side of the toilet bag so that it coincides with the buttonhole.



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
